

## Olive Grove Charter Schools, Inc. High School Graduation Requirements

In order to graduate from an Olive Grove Charter School, students must complete a minimum of 210 total credits divided between subject requirements and electives as outlined below, and demonstrate mastery of state-mandated algebra concepts.

All credits must be earned from an accredited institution.

A letter grade of "D" or better is considered passing for graduation.

Unless otherwise specified, each course shall have a duration of one school year.

- 1. English Language Arts Four courses (40 credits)
- 2. Mathematics Two courses (20 credits), including one year of Algebra 1
  - Students must complete at least two courses in mathematics in grades 9 to 12 inclusive.
  - One or a combination of these courses must meet or exceed the rigor of the content standards of Algebra 1 or Mathematics 1.
  - If Algebra 1 is completed prior to enrollment in grade 9, the student must still complete two courses of mathematics in grades 9 to 12.
- **3. Social Studies** Three courses (30 credits), including:
  - a. one course in United States History
  - b. one course in World History
  - c. a one-semester course in American Government and
  - d. a one-semester course in Economics\*.
    - \*Note that pursuant to AB 2927 [2024], commencing with students graduating in the 2030-31 school year, a student who completes the below-referenced one-semester personal finance course requirement may elect to be exempt from this one-semester course in economics requirement.
- **4. Science** Two courses (20 credits), including one course in the biological sciences and one course in the physical sciences
- 5. Visual/Performing Arts (VPA) OR World Language OR Career Technical Education (CTE) One course (10 credits)
  - In order to satisfy this requirement, a student must complete one complete course (10 credits) in the same subject, e.g. one full year of a World Language or one full year of fine arts or one full year of a CTE course.
- **6.** Physical Education Two courses (20 credits)
- 7. Ethnic Studies One semester (5 credits)

Commencing with students graduating in the 2029–30 school year.

- **8. Personal Finance** One semester course (5 credits) *Commencing with students graduating in the 2030–31 school year.*
- 9. Health One semester course (5 credits)
- 10. Technology/Vocational/Life Skills Two semester courses (10 credits)

## 11. Electives -

- Eleven semester courses (55 credits) *Applicable to students graduating in school years 2024-25 through 2028-29.*
- Ten semester courses (50 credits) Commencing with students graduating in the 2029–30 school year.

## Courses Required for California State University and University of California Admission

The University of California (UC) and the California State University (CSU) systems have established a uniform minimum set of courses required for admission as a freshman. The UC maintains public "A—G" course lists that provide complete information about the high school courses approved for admission to the university. In addition to the required courses, California public universities have other requirements for admission as a freshman: UC Freshman Admission Requirements; CSU Freshman Admission Requirements.
