

School districts receive funding from different sources: state funds under the Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF), other state funds, local funds, and federal funds. LCFF funds include a base level of funding for all LEAs and extra funding - called "supplemental and concentration" grants - to LEAs based on the enrollment of high needs students (foster youth, English learners, and low-income students).

### Budget Overview for the 2025-26 School Year




This chart shows the total general purpose revenue Olive Grove Charter School - Buellton expects to receive in the coming year from all sources.

The text description for the above chart is as follows: The total revenue projected for Olive Grove Charter School - Buellton is \$657,164, of which \$558,792 is Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF), \$82,927 is other state funds, \$6,100 is local funds, and \$9,345 is federal funds. Of the \$558,792 in LCFF Funds,

\$51,224 is generated based on the enrollment of high needs students (foster youth, English learner, and low-income students).

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The LCFF gives school districts more flexibility in deciding how to use state funds. In exchange, school districts must work with parents, educators, students, and the community to develop a Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP) that shows how they will use these funds to serve students.



This chart provides a quick summary of how much Olive Grove Charter School - Buellton plans to spend for 2025-26. It shows how much of the total is tied to planned actions and services in the LCAP.

The text description of the above chart is as follows: Olive Grove Charter School - Buellton plans to spend \$659,947 for the 2025-26 school year. Of that amount, \$398,500 is tied to actions/services in the LCAP and \$261,447 is not included in the LCAP. ## Increased or Improved Services for High Needs Students in the LCAP for the 2025-26 School Year

In 2025-26, Olive Grove Charter School - Buellton is projecting it will receive \$51,224 based on the enrollment of foster youth, English learner, and low-income students. Olive Grove Charter School - Buellton must describe how it intends to increase or improve services for high needs students in the LCAP. Olive Grove Charter School - Buellton plans to spend \$272,000 towards meeting this requirement, as described in the LCAP.
